The corona virus COVID-19 pandemic is the defining global health crisis of our time and the greatest challenge we have faced since World War II. Since its beginning in Asia late last year, the virus has spread to every continent except Antarctica.

Countries are racing to slow the spread of the disease by testing and treating patients, carrying out contact tracing, limiting travel, quarantining citizens, and canceling large gatherings such as sporting events, concerts, and schools.

The pandemic is moving like a wave-one that may yet crash on those least able to cope. Everyone should comply with the measures put in place in Egypt to limit the spread of corona virus (COVID-19).

The Egyptian authorities response to the corona virus is evolving, and local measures may change and new restrictions be introduced at short notice and without warning. WHO (The World Health Organization) tried to remain people calm and collected via awareness advertisements.

The authorities may announce the closure of **public** spaces, including parks and beaches at short notice, in particular around public holidays. You should follow the guidance of the local authorities. The wearing of face masks is **mandatory** in closed public spaces, including government buildings, private offices, malls and public transport including private taxis. Legal punishments could be applied for non-compliance.

The Egyptian authorities may impose mandatory quarantine for visitors who test positive for corona virus in a government isolation hospital. Access for family members could be heavily restricted or impossible. Your emotional and mental well-being is important.







The Earth's Climate is Changing

Most scientists and governments agree that the Earth's climate is changing. It is warming probably due to increased levels of carbon dioxide (CO2) in the atmosphere. Some changes are natural. But people are changing the climate in many ways, too. Here are two examples.



We are changing the air:

We are changing the air. We are adding carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gases to the air. These gases change the Earth's climate.

- Now there is too much of these greenhouse gases in the atmosphere. So, the Earth is warming too quickly.
- Many countries are making plans to reduce greenhouse gases.

Carbon dioxide goes into the air when we burn oil, gas and coal. We use these fuels for many things.

What are greenhouse gases?

The Earth's atmosphere contains gases. Some gases help keep the Earth warm. They are called greenhouse gases. For example: (CO2). Greenhouse gases trap heat in the atmosphere. They are like the glass in a greenhouse. The Earth would be very cold without these gases.



We are changing the land:



We are changing the land. These changes <u>affect</u> the Earth's climate. For example, we are cutting down trees and burning forests. How do trees affect climate? They remove carbon dioxide from the air. So, it's harmful to cut them down.



Climate change now

How is climate change affecting us now? Scientists see changes in many

places. For example, air and ocean temperatures are rising.



There is less ice in the Arctic.

Climate change in the future

Scientists are predicting many changes for the future. Many changes will be bad. For example:

◆ There may be more storms, floods, droughts, forest fires and insects in some countries in the world. There may be less water in our lakes. Sea level will rise. Water will flood areas in some countries. Millions of people may have to leave their homes.

→ What to do?

Climate change is a world problem. It will affect our



lives for hundreds of years.

How can people help slow climate change? They can use less energy. For example, they can use their cars less often. They can use **fluorescent** light bulbs.

Taha Hussein was an Egyptian writer who educated people, and wrote novels. He was born on November 4, 1889 in a mill town in Egypt. He became blind at the age of three from a combination of eye disease and folk medicine. Hussein overcame poverty and blindness to become a leading cultural and public figure in Egypt. He served as minister of education in 1951 and 1952. Although he became blind at a young age, he still went to school and studied hard. "He went to the Egyptian University where he learned about the Egyptian and European cultures. He received his first doctorate by the university for his thesis on Abu-l-Ala all Maarri, the blind Syrian philosopher". Because of his perseverance and his hard work, Hussein won a scholarship in a University in France. Hussein wrote individual volumes that had life lessons for people. "The Future of Culture in Egypt reflects Hussein's appreciation of Western culture and urges Egyptians to adapt to modern life. Taha Hussein liked literature. He wrote short stories, novels, and he educated people. In 1951-52, he served as the minister of education. (3) The Olympics' official motto is "Citius, Altius, Fortius". This is Latin for "Swifter, Higher, Stronger". It represents the Olympic spirit, supposed to be presented throughout the games and generally held to be a celebration of brotherhood, competition, sportsmanship, goodwill and peace. The Games help us see how similar we are, and help us celebrate our humanity.


(4) Medals are awarded in each event, with gold medals for first place, silver for second and bronze for third, a tradition that started in 1904. Months before each Games, the Olympic flame is lit in Olympia in a ceremony that reflects ancient Greek rituals.

(5) The Olympic Games consists of 26 sports, 30 disciplines and nearly 300 events. The Summer Olympics programme includes 26 sports, while the Winter Olympics programme is 15 sports. Athletics, swimming, and artistic gymnastics are the only summer sports that have never been absent from the Olympic programme.
